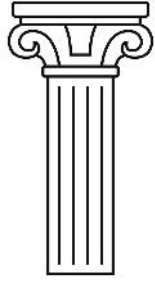

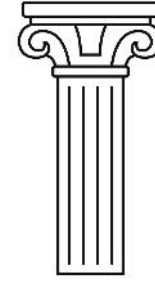

A Model City

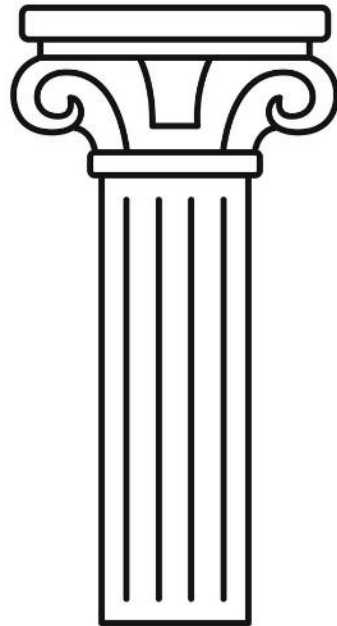
